In freestyle, McLean jumped on the Fintastics and raced out to an early lead. First place finishers included **Stephanie Hallock**, **Kristen Callahan**, **Rob Burton** and **Jennifer Dolson**. Second place points were earned by **Stacey Forsyth**, **Matthew Montgomery** and **Lindsay Ward**. **Alina Suyama**, **Leanne Hyer**, **Jason Hornbeck**, **Jason Happ**, **Brian Pujanauski** and Julia Richmond added third place points.

McLean actually widened the lead in backstroke but a string of first place finishes kept the meet interesting. First place honors went to **Stephanie Hallock** and brother **Michael Hallock**, **Christopher Kearns** and brother **Zachary Kearns** and to **Justin Forsyth**. Finishing in second were **Leanne Hyer**, **Stacey Forsyth**, **Thomas Burton** and **Julia Richmond**. Third place points were added **by Cory Pinegar**, **Abby Reed** and **Lindsay Ward**. McLean was out in front my 25 points, but the Fintastics were ready to make a move.

The Fintastics usually pile on the points in breaststroke, and Saturday was no exception. Rushing into first place were Alina Suyama, Christian Tiedge, Katherine Leeds, Jason Hornbeck. Suzanne Huycke, Matthew Montgomery, Kirsten Siebach and Jennifer Dolson. Second place finishers included Spencer Tiedge, Bobby Demson, Sally Wade, Brian Pujanauski and Jennifer Callahan. Third place points were gathering up by Abby Reed, Lauren Angel, Abby Clement, Zachary Kearns, Melissa Duvall, Rob Burton and Jennifer Leeds. After trailing all meet, suddenly Fox Mill Woods was in the lead, 139-129.

First place finishers in fly were repeat winners for the day: Michael Hallock, Kristen Callahan, Christopher Kearns and Kirsten Siebach. Second place Fintastics included Suzanne Huycke, Jason Happ and Justin Forsyth. Finishing third were Andy Putch, Allison Pinegar, Kevin Pujanauski, Thomas Burton, Melissa Duvall, Brendan Lins and Hannah Cohen. The Fintastics were in the lead, but they needed to do well in the relays to bring home a victory.

In relays, the 8 and under girls, Chloe Siebach, Alina Suyama, Abby Reed and Stephanie Hallock, won with a time of 1:35.40. In the 9-10 medley, the 9-10 girls, Allison Pinegar, Katherine Leeds, Kristen Callahan and Leanne Hyer, won with a time of 1:23.98. In the 11-12 boys medley, Liam Mclaughlin, Edward Reed, Jason Hornbeck Christopher Kearns won with a time of 1:16.92. In the 13-14 boys medley, **Zachary** Kearns, Matthew Montgomery, Jason Happ and Steven Matthews-Rurak won with a time of 1:07.43, besting the boys from McLean by nearly seven seconds.

Alas, the Fintastics could not pull out another win in the final five events and lost narrowly to the swimmers from McLean. Coach Shelley said, "We had a fantastic effort at McLean and I couldn't be prouder of this team in it first meet. Let's keep having good practices and maintain our strong team spirit. We will have a strong shot at winning this upcoming week."

Notable improvements this week: Melissa Duvall and Christopher Kearns, a 12 percent improvement in fly, Kevin Pujanauski, an 11 percent improvement in fly and Kirsten Siebach, a 10 percent improvement in fly; Liam McLaughlin, a 13 percent improvement in back; and Chris Fertal, an 11 percent improvement in freestyle. Congratulations to many others who significantly improved their times this week!

The Monday Night Face-off: Fox Mill Woods vs. Pinecrest

On Monday night, the FMW Fintastics met the Pinecrest Piranhas for the first B-meet of the season. Under hot and humid conditions, our swimmers showed gutsy determination. With 175 on the roster, Pinecrest is one of the deepest squads we face. Proving that size isn't everything, FMW swimmers turned in great performances, with many personal best times. A big "thank you" to the volunteers who toiled long into the night—we know it was a late one! Perhaps next year, we'll have to invest in night-vision goggles and glow-in-the-dark bathing suits!

The following are some highlights of our swimmers' achievements:

Freestyle

In the boys 6 and under, **Jack Traxler** swam to a fifth place finish for FMW. The 6 and under Lady Fintastics swept this event with the following finishes: **Liana Pendleton**, first, **Natalie Anderson**, 2nd, **Natalie Toma**, 3rd, **Allie Delgado**, 4th, **Colette Toma**, 5th and **Jackie Trautman**, 6th. The 7 & 8 boys brought home first (**Andrew Gyenis**) and third (**Patrick Cary**) while the girls grabbed second (**Abbey Reed**) and third (**Catherine Humphrey**).

Top honors belonged to **Andy Putch** in the 9-year-old freestyle. FMW's **Steven Robbin's** took fourth and **Charlie McRoberts**, fifth. **Amanda Bailey** stroked to a fifth place finish, followed closely by **Allison Brouchman** at sixth. **Bobby Demson** bested the field to take first in the 10-year-old free. **David Rawlins** took the fourth place spot. **Allison Pinegar** stepped up and finished first in the 10-year-old girls' event. **Kimberly Blauer** grabbed sixth place.

FMW took both first place finishes in the 11-12 freestyle, thanks to **Will Byrne** and **Ana Demson**. **Edward Reed** picked up fourth place for the boys and **Katie Callahan** did likewise for the girls. **Melissa Jarmas** pulled out a fifth place finish for the team.

Sascha Reed led the pack to finish first in the 13-14 girls' event, followed by **Melissa Duvall** (fifth place) and **Kayley Byrne** (sixth place). **Steven Matthews** came up with a fifth place finish in the boys' event.

FMW's 15-18 year old boy swimmers turned in a strong performance in the freestyle, taking third (**Brendan Lins**), fourth (**Mike Leeds**), fifth (**Pat Hines**) and sixth (**Joey Coffinberger**). The girls brought home second (**Allison Kendrick**), fourth (**Hannah Cohen**) and sixth (**Jen Leeds**). Great job, team!

Backstroke

In the boys 6 and under backstroke, Jack Traxler turned in another strong performance to finish third. Patrick Gyenis also swam well, finishing fifth. The six and under girls wowed the crowd by taking first (Natalie Anderson), second (Liana Pendleton), third (Natalie Toma) and fourth (Colette Toma). Andrew Gyenis topped the field with a first place finish in the boys 7-8 backstroke. J.T. Byrne, Chris Fertal and Timmie Rawlins were getting it done by grabbing third, fifth and sixth places, respectively. Leann Muncy and Emily Wade brought home fifth and sixth place finishes for the 7 & 8 year old girls.

Steven Robbins was #1 in the boy's 9-10 event, while Allison Pinegar stood atop the field for the girls. Lindsay Toma stroked her way to third place. In the boys 11-12 backstroke, Edward Reed finished first, followed by John Suyama in third. Melissa Duvall gave a strong performance, taking third in the girls' 13-14 backstroke event. Lindsay Pujanowski held on for third in the girls' 15-18 back. Great effort, everybody!

Breaststroke

Natalie Anderson snagged first place in the 6 and under girls' event with a time of 44.45. **Andrew Gyenis** took second and **Harper McGrath,** fourth, for FMW in the boys' 7-8 event. The 7-8 girls took the two top spots, with **Margaret**

Murphy finishing first and **Stephanie Hillock**, second. **Emily Wade** placed fifth in this event. For the 9-10 girls, **Kimberly Blauer** finished fifth.

The 11-12 girls took first (Katie Callahan), third (Rosie Montgomery) and fourth (Erica Demson), while the boys in the same age group placed fifth (Liam McLaughlin) and sixth (Will Byrne).

Steven Matthews-Rurak finished fifth in the boys' 13-14 heat. **Anna Clement** took second, **Kayley Byrne**, fourth and **Lindsay Ward**, fifth for FMW in the girls' race.

Our oldest swimmers made a strong showing, with **Patrick Hines** finishing second and **Brendan Lins**, third, in the 15-18 category. **Hannah Cohen** grabbed second, **Lindsey Pujanowski**, fifth and **Bridget Lins**, sixth for the girls.

Butterfly

Andrew Gyenis was the first swimmer to touch the wall for the 8 and under boys in the 'fly. Abby Reed took second and Mary Stoney, third in the 8 and under girls' event. Top honors went to 9-10 boys Bobby Demson (first) and Andy Putch (second). Alison Jarmas took home third place honors for the 9-10 girls.

Ana Demson came in first for the 11-12 girls and Sascha Reed did the same in the 13-14 age group. Lindsay Ward followed her in with a third place finish. Amanda Hubal powered to a second place finish and Lindsey Pujanowski did well, placing fourth for the 15-18 year old girls.

Individual Medley

Again, Andrew Gyenis in first place—this time for the 9 and under boys' IM. Andy Putch held on for fourth. Kristen Callahan bested the other 9 and under girls with a time of 1:35.34. Her teammates, Allison Jarmas and Abby Reed finished fourth and fifth. Michael Hallock placed second in the 10-year-old boys' IM, followed by Bobby Demson in fourth.

Katherine Leeds was first in the same age group for the girls.

The 11-12 boys of FMW brought home third (Chris Kearns) and sixth (Edward Reed). Their female counterparts had a strong showing with Suzanne Huycke taking second, Ana Demson, fourth, Katie Callahan fifth and Erica Demson, sixth.

Matt Montgomery outswam the others to finish first in the boys 13-14 event, while Zach Kearns turned in a fourth place finish. Kirsten Siebach brought home second and Lindsay Ward, fifth for the team. Allison Kendrick, Jennifer Nelson and Hannah Cohen swept the top three spots in the girls' 15-18 IM. Rob Burton placed third for the boys.
