Fox Mill Woods Fintastics vs. the Hiddenbrook Hurricanes -July 6, 2002

Fox Mill Woods played host to the Hiddenbrook Hurricanes under clear blue skies and cool breezes in week three of the summer season. Everyone was excited about the opportunity to get two wins back to back. In order to secure a victory, Coach Shelley felt the 8 and under boys and girls needed to step up.

In freestyle, the younger swimmers wasted no time. **Andrew Gyenis** placed first for the 8 and under boys and the girls swept, with **Stephanie Hallock** finishing first, **Catherine Humphrey** finishing second and **Abby Reed** gaining third. Other first place finishers in freestyle included

Kristen Callahan, Stacey Forsyth, Scott Hubal and Justin Forsyth. Bobbie Demson, Christopher Kearns and Lindsay Ward earned additional second place points. Other third place finishers included Andy Putch, Sascha Reed and Jennifer Dolson. The Fintastics were off to a strong start and a narrow 46-44 lead.

The Fintastics continued with another strong performance in backstroke, with all age groups contributing points. The boys 9-10 backstrokers swept their event with Michael Hallock taking first with a team record 36.82, Dan Traxler taking second and Steven Robbins finishing third. Other first place finishes were earned by Andrew Gyenis, Stephanie Hallock, Leanne Hyer, Edward Reed, Matthew Montgomery and **Rob Burton**. Other second place honors went to Abby Reed, Alison Jarmas, Christopher Kearns, Stacey Forsyth, Zachary Kearns, Lindsay Ward and Allison Kendrick. Rosie Montgomery added a third place finish. This flood of backstroke points helped Fox Mill Woods rush out to a 107-73 lead.

In breastroke, the Fintastics found strong contributors in all age groups. Just as our swimmers swept at least one event in free and back, the trio of Kirsten Siebach, with a first, Melissa Duvall, taking a second and Anna Clement, finishing third, added a Fintastic sweep in breast. Other first place honors were earned by Alina Suyama, Michael Hallock, Sally Wade, Suzanne Huycke, Scott Hubal and Brian Pujanauski. Second placers included Emily Wade, Liam McLaughlin, Katie Callahan, Melissa Duvall and Patrick Hines. Third place points were gathered up by Harper McGrath, Dan Traxler, Caroline Beury and Jennifer Callahan. The Fintastics were finding themselves in a fun place, ahead 162-108.

Fox Mill Woods was now gliding around the pool like a powerful predator fish and the butterfly event gave them another opportunity to gobble up points. First place finishers included Kristen Callahan, Edward Reed, Jason Happ, Rob Burton and Allison Kendrick. Second place Fintastics included Bobby Demson, Suzanne Huycke, Matthew Montgomery, Sascha Reed and Amanda Hubal. Finishing third were Andy Putch and Justin Forsyth. Score, Fox Mill Woods, 204-135.

The Fintastics continued to feast on the competition during the relays, winning nine of 12 events.

The 8 and under girls, Catherine Humphrey, Alina Suyama, Abby Reed and Stephanie Hallock, took the 100 meter freestyle relay with a time of 1:35.62. We won both 9-10 100-meter medleys. The boys, including Dan Traxler, Bobby Demson, Andy Putch and Michael Hallock, triumphed with a time of 1:29.11. The girls, including Sally Wade, Kristen Callahan, Alison Jarmas and Leanne Hyer, won with a time of 1:28.81.

The 11-12 boys, including Edward Reed, Liam McLaughlin, Kevin Pujanauski and Christopher Kearns, won with a time of 1:18.63. Both 13-14 medley teams took first. The boys, including Matthew Montgomery, Jason Happ, Scott Hubal and Zachary Kearns, took first with a time of 1:04.66. The girls, with Kirsten Siebach, Lindsay Ward, Kayley Byrne and Sascha Reed, won with a time of 1:08.65.

The 15-18 200 meter medley boys team, including **Brian Pujanauski**, **Rob Burton**, **Patrick Hines** and **Justin Forsyth**, won with a time of 2:13.58. In the mixed age 200 meter freestyle relays, both boys and girls teams ruled. In the boys' heat, the team of **Christopher Kearns**, **Michael Hallock**, **Scott Hubal** and **Justin Forsyth** coasted to a big win with a time

of 2:05.34. In the girls heat, the swim meet ended with a thrilling finish. The girls, **Stacey Forsyth, Kristen Callahan, Sascha Reed** and **Jennifer Dolson**, prevailed with a time of 2:15.05, just nipping the Hiddenbrook time of 2:15:12. Fox Mill Woods had completed another fantastic meet, winning 249-145.

Coach Shelley said, "I want to thank the swimmers for practicing hard this week and turning in strong performances against Hiddenbrook. I especially want to shine the spotlight on our 8 and under swimmers who swam hard in all events and who are coming on strong. Let's keep the momentum going for the next meet!" Fox Mill Woods is 2-1 for the campaign.

Our notable improvers this week included **Caroline Beury**, with a 14 percent gain in freestyle and a 7 percent improvement in breaststroke. Congratulations to many others who significantly improved their times this week!

We have been watching them work hard at practice and it's great to see the results. Here's how we did against tough Division 3 swimmers:

Freestyle

We saw **Jack Traxler** take sixth place in the six and under boys with a 14% improvement in his time. **Liana Pendleton** claimed fourth and **Natalie Toma**, sixth, in the girls event.

J.T. Byrne grabbed sixth place in the 7 - 8 year old boys' event, while **Mary Stoney** improved her time and took third place for the girls.

Our 9-year-old boys came on strong with first place going to **Dan Traxler**, second to **Steven Robbins** and fifth to **Charlie McRoberts**. In the girls' event, **Alison Jarmas** brought home sixth place.

In the 10-year-old event, **David Rawlins** took fourth for our boys, while **Lauren Angel** zipped in for second place, followed closely by **Kimberly Blauer** for third in the girls' event.

Liam Mclaughlin and Jack Brennan swam to a photo finish in the boys 11-12 freestyle, with second place going to Liam and third to Jack. Welcome back, Jack! Our 11-12 girls are getting faster every day - this tight race saw Abby Clement take second place and Katie Callahan, third, both with time improvements.

Steven Matthews-Rurak swam to a first place finish in the 13-14 boys freestyle. This great result was the challenge our dynamic group of girls needed to sweep the top four spots! Backstroke

Breaststroke

Butterfly
