<u>Fox Mill Woods Fintastics vs. Cottontail -</u> July 13, 2002

The weather felt cool but Coach Shelley knew her swimmers needed to be hot. Fox Mill Woods was visiting the Cottontail Cobias in week four of the summer season. On the line: three straight wins and a piece of the division lead. "The teams are evenly matched. The

swimmers who have come to race this morning will lead their team to victory," Coach Shelley said.

In freestyle, neither team could break out to a significant lead. First place finishes were earned by Andrew Gyenis, Bobbie Demson, Michael Hallock, Ana Demson, Scott Hubal and Sascha Reed. Finishing second were Leanne Hyer, William Byrne and Jennifer Dolson. Third place points were added by Stephanie Hallock, Andy Putch, Jason Happ and Lindsay Ward. The Fintastics were off to a narrow 47-43 lead.

As in earlier weeks, The Fintastics began to build on the lead in backstroke. Finishing first were Andrew Gyenis, Dan Traxler, Allison Pinegar, Michael Hallock, Matthew Montgomery and Lindsay Ward. Second place honors included Steven Robbins, Christopher Kearns, Suzanne Huycke, Zachary Kearns and Rob Burton. Important third place points were delivered by Patrick Cary, Stephanie Hallock, Leanne Hyer, Edward Reed, Rosie Montgomery, Thomas Burton and Julia Richmond.

In breastroke, our Fintastics found the Cobias to be a challenge. First placers from Fox Mill Woods included Kristen Callahan, Matthew Montgomery and Kirsten Siebach. Finishing second were Suzanne Huycke, Brian Pujanauski and Jennifer Dolson. Coming in third were Alina Suyama, Dan Traxler, Katherine Leeds, Liam McLaughlin, Katie Callahan and Jennifer Callahan. But all of the sudden, the Cobias were spanking the Fintastics. 141-129. Now Fox Mill Woods needed to regroup in butterfly so we stand a chance in the relays.

And just when we needed some points, our butterfliers raced out to four straight first place finishes. Winning their heats were Bobby Demson, Kristen Callahan, Christopher Kearns, Ana Demson and Sascha Reed. Taking second were Scott Hubal, Kirsten Siebach, Rob Burton and Allison Kendrick. Taking third were Allison Pinegar, Edward Reed, Erica Demson and Jason Happ. Fox Mill Woods had splashed back into contention and were now behind only 172-170.

The Fintastics needed to win the relays, 7-5, in order to prevail over the Cobias. After dropping the first two events, Fox Mill Woods reeled off six straight wins and victory was within reach!

We won both 9-10 100-meter medleys. The boys, including **Dan Traxler, Bobby Demson, Andy Putch** and **Steven Robbins**, narrowly triumphed with a time of 1:34.84 versus 1:35.07. The girls, including **Katherine Leeds, Kristen Callahan, Leanne Hyer** and **Allison Pinegar**, easily won with a time of 1:25.00.

We also won both 11-12 100-meter medleys. The boys, including **Christopher Kearns, Edward Reed, Kevin Pujanauski** and **Michael Hallock**, won with a time of 1:15.87. The girls, including **Katie Callahan, Ana Demson, Abby Clement** and **Suzanne Huycke**, won with a time of 1:12.12.

In winning the 13-14 medley relays, the boys swam against no competition. **Jason Happ, Scott Hubal, William Byrne** and **Zachary Kearns** won with a time of 1:11.37. The girls also won, but against real live competition! **Kirsten Siebach, Sascha Reed, Kayley Byrne** and **Lindsay Ward** won with a time of 1:09.93.

There were four events to go. We need just one more win! It would be up to the boys in the mixed age 200-meter freestyle relay. In a

thrilling race that was decided by less than a second, **Michael Hallock**, **Bobby Demson**, **Scott Hubal** and **Rob Burton** held on and won with a time of 2:12,06 yersus 2:13,17.

Fox Mill Woods had another win under its fin, its third straight, the final score standing at 205-197. The swim team record to date was three wins versus one loss.

Coach Shelley said, "I asked my team to really race because we were so evenly matched against Cottontail. Every point mattered, no matter if it was first, second or third and our swimmers stepped up. It was great watching them battle it out, especially in the relays where Cottontail had several all-star relay teams. We are having a fantastic season. Let's see if we can take first place next week with a win!"

Our notable improvers this week included **Jack Brennan**, with a 6 percent gain in breaststroke; **Melissa Jarmas**, with a 9 percent improvement in fly; **Meagan McRoberts**, with a 6 percent gain in breaststroke and **Spencer Tiedge**, with a 6 percent improvement in breaststroke. Congratulations to many others who significantly improved their times this week!

Breaststroke
