## Fox Mill WoodsFintastics vs.RiversideGardens Tsunamis -July 20, 2002

Going into the final week of the regular swim season, Fox Mill Woods had the opportunity to complete one of its best seasons ever, grab a fourth straight win, and secure at least second place in the division. The Riverside Gardens Tsunami was visiting our home pool, and once again the Fintastics were facing a team with similar times and lots of good racers. "It's a replay of our last couple of weeks," said Coach Shelley. "The teams are evenly matched and we need to grab every point we can because it will probably come down to the final relays."

In freestyle, the first event, Coach Shelley was proved right. Neither team could build a wide lead. Swimming 8-and-under 25-meter freestyle, Andrew Gyenis and Stephanie Hallock both finished first. In 9-10, 50-meter free, Bobby Demson finished second and Kristen Callahan and Katherine Leeds finished second-third. In the 11-12 age group, Michael Hallock grabbed a second and Stacey Forsyth and Katie Callahan finished two-three. Matthew Montgomery snagged a much-needed first in 13-14, followed by Jason Happ in second, and Lindsay Ward and Sascha Reed did a second-third on the girls' side. Justin Forsyth finished first in 15-18 boys, with Jennifer Dolson and Allison Kendrick taking a second-third for the girls. With all the

balanced scoring, the Fintastics were off to a narrow 46-44 lead.

Coach Shelley asked the team to build a lead in backstroke and they responded. Andrew Gyenis took a first and Stephanie Hallock finished second in 8 and under. Dan Traxler finished third and Allison Pinegar finished second in 9-10. Michael Hallock finished first in 11-12 boys, and our girls, Stacey Forsyth, Ana Demson and Rosie Montgomery pulled off a 1sweep. In 13-14 2-3 boys, Matthew Montgomery and Zachary Kearns finished first-second and Lindsav Ward and Anna Clement took first-third. In 15-18, Justin Forsyth won and Julia Richmond finished second. And just as Coach Shelley asked, Fox Mill Woods had built a little cushion into the meet, with us ahead 94-86.

In breaststroke, the Fintastics started slowly and gave up the meet lead, but we eventually found our fins and raced ahead to stay. In 8-and-under girls, Alina Suyama took a second place and in 9-10 girls, Katherine Leeds won and Sally Wade finished second. In 11-12 boys Liam McLaughlin finished third and Suzanne Huvcke and Katie Callahan finished 1-2 for the girls. Scott Hubal and Zachary Kearns finished 2-3 for the 13-14 boys, while Kirsten Siebach grabbed second for the girls. The 15-18 boys and girls dominated their bracket, with **Rob** Burton, Patrick Hines and Michael Leeds finishing in a 1-2-3 sweep, and **Jennifer Dolson** and Jennifer Callahan finishing 1-2 for the girls. All of the sudden the Fintastics were back in a lead, 138-132.

Our butterfliers extended the lead with balanced attack in all age groups. **Bobby Demson** finished second in 9-10 boys, with **Kristen Callahan** and **Allison Pinegar** finishing 2-3 for the girls. **Suzanne Huycke** and **Ana Demson** finished first and third for the 11-12 girls, and **Christopher Kearns** took second for the boys. In 13-14, **Scott Hubal** and **Jason Happ** finished 1-2 and **Sascha Reed** and **Kirsten Siebach** finished 2-3 for the girls. In the 1518 bracket, **Rob Burton** finished first and **Brendan Lins** third for the boys, while **Allison Kendrick** took second and **Amanda Hubal** finished third for the girls. By racing hard all through the 'fly, Fox Mill Woods was able to widen the lead to 176-166 going into relays.

The relays opened with the Fintastics dropping the first three events and losing the lead. But the 9-10 girls 100 meter medley team of **Katherine Leeds, Kristen Callahan, Leanne Hyer** and **Allison Pinegar** valiantly raced to 1:22.96-1:23.16 photo-finish victory which pulled us back into a tie. Again, the 11-12 girls, **Suzanne Huycke, Ana Demson, Katie Callahan** and **Stacey Forsyth**, winning with a time of 1:12.41, got us back into a tie.

The 13-14 boys, **Zachary Kearns, Jason Happ, Matthew Montgomery** and **Scott Hubal**, won with a time of 1:03.31, and kept us near the lead. Then we raced to three straight wins and clinched the meet.

In the 15-18, 200-meter medleys, the boys, **Patrick Hines, Rob Burton, Michael Leeds** and **Justin Forsyth**, won with a time of 2:11.40 to 2:24.41. And the girls, **Jennifer Callahan**, **Amanda Hubal, Jennifer Dolson** and **Allison Kendrick**, won by 2:22.34 versus 2:29.13. And in the mixed age, 200 meter freestyle relay, the boys team of **Michael Hallock, Bobby Demson**, **Scott Hubal** and **Justin Forsyth**, won with a time of 2:10.34 to 2:12.09.

Fox Mill Woods had raced to its fourth straight victory and a Fintastic 4-1 summer record, the final score standing at 206-196. **Coach Shelley** said, "The boys and girls did everything I asked of them and they came out big winners. All summer long in practice I stressed racing hard and they really pulled it off in the meet when it mattered. I couldn't be more proud of this fine group of kids. A special thanks to my assistant coach **Tommy Huycke** and to all my 15-18

leaders and to all the moms and dads who did so much to help us be a success this summer."

Our notable improvers this week included Mary Stoney, with a 11 percent improvement in backstroke; Chris Fertal, an 8 percent improvement in freestyle; Spencer Tiedge, a 6 percent improvement in breaststroke; Jason Happ, a 6 percent improvement in freestyle; Steven Matthews-Rurak, a 6 percent improvement in breaststroke; and Harper McGrath, a 6 percent improvement in breaststroke. Congratulations to many others who significantly improved their times this week!

#### Freestyle

Our youngest swimmers got us off to a great start with a first place finish to **Jack Stoney**, second to **Kevin Wall**, fourth to **Patrick Gyenis**, and fifth to **Tommy Lopez** in the 6 & under boys. The girls continued the pace with first place going to **Paige Humphrey**, followed very closely by **Liana Pendleton** in second, **Natalie Toma** in fourth and **Allie Delgado** in fifth.

Our 7 and 8 year olds were on fire as Chris Fertal took first place, Patrick Cary second, J.T. Byrne third, Jonathan Nichols fourth and Kirby Vitek fifth. Once again we had a complete sweep by our girls with Alina Suyama taking first place, Mary Stoney, second, Elizabeth Dubois, third, Leeann Muncy, fourth, Sarah Wall, fifth and Catherine Muncy, sixth.



Steven Robbins took first place followed by Charlie McRoberts in second in the boys' 9 year old freestyle. Our girls had a strong showing with Amanda Bailey in first, Allison Brouckman in third, Caroline Beury in fourth, Elizabeth Osborn in fifth and Dani Barlow in sixth.

#### Backstroke
