<u>Fox Mill Woods Fintastics vs. Highlands</u> Swim Club -July 12, 2003

The Fintastics went into the fourth swim meet of the summer season facing the Highlands Swim Whomping Turtles, the toughest test of the year. The Turtles, like Fox Mill Woods, were undefeated. And they were carrying a full roster of swimmers, with everyone healthy and available. The Fintastics, on the other hand, were still battling a variety of injuries, viruses and scheduling conflicts that kept a number of Saturday regulars away from the pool.

Scott Hubal, holder of numerous Fintastic team records, continued to swim at a rarified level at this meet. He broke two records, in 50-meter freestyle and butterfly, and continued to be an example of grace and style in the pool to the swimmers on both teams.

The Fintastic freestylers swam valiantly to lead off the meet. Finishing first were **Gregory DeRosa**, **Stephanie Hallock**, **Andrew Gyenis** and **Scott Hubal**. Scott, as usual, swam magnificently, and set still another team record, finishing the 13-14 50 meter freestyle heat with a time of 26.55. Second place finishers included **Suzanne Huycke**, **Justin Forsyth** and **Jennifer Dolson**. Finishing third were **Edward Reed**, **Katie Callahan**, **Thomas Burton** and **Matthew Montgomery**. The score at the end of free was Highlands Swim 56, Fox Mill Woods 34.

Our backstroke racers continued their strong finishes and prevented the Turtles from establishing a more significant lead. First place went to **Stephanie Hallock**, **Leanne Hyer**, **Michael Hallock**, **Suzanne Huycke** and **Allison Kendrick**. Second place points were won by

Jack Traxler, Andrew Gyenis and Matthew Montgomery. Third place finishers included J.T. Byrne, Alison Jarmas, Edward Reed, Allison Pinegar and Thomas Burton. The Turtles were still ahead, 102-78.

In breaststroke, the Turtles widened the lead. Finishing first for Fox Mill Woods were Gregory DeRosa, Leanne Hyer, Liam McLaughlin and Jennifer Callahan. Second place finishers included Emily Wade, Steven Robbins, Katie Callahan and Rob Burton. Finishing third were Liana Pendleton, Alina Suyama, Rosie Montgomery, Michael Leeds and Jennifer Dolson. The Fintastics now trailed 154-116.

The Fintastics continued to battle in butterfly. In fact, **Scott Hubal** battled so hard he broke the record in 13-14 50 meter 'fly, with a time of 29.76. Other first place finishers included **Alison Jarmas, Michael Hallock, Rob Burton** and **Allison Kendrick**. Second place laurels went to **Brendan Lin.** Finishing third were **Melissa Jarmas** and **Melissa Duval**. Going into relays, Fox Mill Woods trailed 190-134.

In the 8-and-under 100-meter freestyle relay, the boys' team, consisting of J.T. Byrne, Jack Stoney, Jack Traxler and Gregory DeRosa, won easily with a time of 1:32.11. The girls 9-10 100-meter medley relay team of Leanne Hyer, Emily Clark, Alison Jarmas and Alina Suyama prevailed with a time of 1:24.52.

The 15-18 200-meter medley relay events provided a huge amount excitement after a string of narrow FMW defeats. The boys' team of **Justin Forsyth, Michael Leeds, Rob Burton** and **Matthew Montgomery** won with a time of 2:07.24. With the crowd screaming themselves hoarse, the girls, including **Allison Kendrick, Jennifer Callahan, Sascha Reed** and **Jennifer Dolson**, won by an eyelash, or perhaps a heartbeat, by one hundredth of one second, in a time of 2:21.08. All the girls swam hard,

including Sascha, who still competed even though she had a sore shoulder.

The final score was Highlands Swim, 235, Fox Mill Woods, 167. The Fintastics fell to 3-1 in Division 6 but have a strong chance to finish second.

Coach Paris said, "I am very proud of these kids. Can you believe that 50 swimmers achieved a new personal best in this meet? Everyone gave it everything they had. We fought hard in every heat and in every relay. We swam very well against extremely tough competition. Well done!"

Notable improvements this week: Making moves against the Turtles were **J.T. Byrne**, a 10 percent improvement in back; **Jeffrey Siebach**, an 8 percent improvement in 'fly; **Lauren Angel**, an 8 percent improvement in 'fly; **Emily Edwards** and **Jennifer Tummarello** both posted 7 percent improvements in freestyle.

Our swimmers just keep amazing us with their abilities. The results were as follows:

Freestyle

Nate Duvall started us off with his first place finish time of 34.25 followed by Jimmy Bailey in third and Connor Irwin taking fifth in the boys 6 and under. The girls then came on strong as Amy O'Connor took second place, Brianna Lottchea, third, Charlotte Edwards, fourth,

Jackie Trautman, fifth and Madelynne Norton, sixth place.

In the 7 and 8 year olds we watched as Jack Traxler earned a second place, Daniel Paddock, a fourth, and Jack Stoney, sixth. FMW ruled the girls' event with Emily Edwards grabbing first with a time of 22.06, closely followed by Meagan McRoberts in second, Laura Brouckman in third, Liana Pendelton in fourth, Paige Humphrey in fifth and Natalie Anderson in sixth place.

Our 9-year-old boys were looking strong as **Patrick Cary** zoomed in for first place with a time of 43.29, followed by **Chris Fertal** in second, **Harper McGrath** in fourth, **Josh Christenson** in fifth and **Jacob Rosenberg** in sixth. Once again FMW girls dominated their event as **Catie Humphrey** grabbed first with a time of 47.55, closely followed by **Jennifer Bailey** in second place, **Margaret Murphy** in third, **Catherine Muncy** in fourth, **Leeann Muncy** in fifth and **Mary Stoney** in sixth place.

In the 10-year-old event **Chris Paddock** grabbed the blue ribbon with a time of 44.90. The girls swept another event as **Allison Brouckman** took first place with a time of 49.51, followed by **Emily Clark** in second, **Caroline Beury** in third, **Dani Barlow** in fourth, **Elizabeth Osborn** in fifth and **Madison Fosse** in sixth place.

Our 11-12 year olds took top honors in both events. **Jack Brennan** raced in for first with a time of 37.76, with **David Rawlins** taking second, **Evan Hyer**, fourth and **Joseph Maguire**, sixth place. Then **Danielle DeRosa** claimed first (37.41) for the girls, closely followed by **Katherine Leeds** in second, **Kristen Callahan** in third, **Allison Pinegar** in fourth and **Lauren Angel** in sixth place.

In the 13-14 age group **Johnny Maguire** swam in for second place in the boys' event. **Ana Demson** grabbed first place (34.86) as **Melissa Duvall** followed in second, **Rosie Montgomery** took third and **Jennifer Turmarell**, sixth place.

Lindsay Ward claimed first place (33.18) in the girls 15-18 event.



Backstroke

In the 6-year-old event **Nate Duvall** snagged his second blue ribbon of the night with a time of 43.24 as **Ben Christenson** followed in second place and **Connor Irwin** in third. Our dominating girls charged in once again with **Jackie Trautman** grabbing first place (38.58), **Charlotte Edwards** earning second, **Claire Rosenberg** third, **Emma Savino** fourth and **Olivia Lebolt** fifth place.

Dan Paddock took second place, Jack Stoney fourth, Jimmy Bailey, fifth, and Mark Fertal, sixth in the 7-8 year old boys' event. What a race, as again our 7-8 year old girls swept their event with Elizabeth Dubois splashing in for first (25.64), very closely followed by Emily Edwards in second, Michaela Gaughan in third, Liana Pendleton in fourth, Laura Brouckman in fifth and Laura Matthews in sixth place. You go, girls!

Kirby Vitek grabbed a blue ribbon in the 9-10 boys with a time of 1:09.34 while **Timmie Rawlins** took second place. Our girls turned in another strong showing as **Dani Barlow** claimed second place, **Caroline Beury**, third, **Leann Muncy**, fourth, **Jennifer Bailey**, fifth and **Madison Melton**, sixth place.

Joseph Maguire took first place (1:04.71) in his 11-12 event. **Danielle DeRosa** looked good in her first place finish (45.16), with **Jenny Rau** taking second, **Emily Chamberlin** third and **Catherine Murphy** fourth.

In 13-14 boys' **Johnny Maguire** claimed a second place finish.

Breaststroke

Our 7-8 boys looked great as **Will Savino** finished first with a time of 36.00 and **Mark Fertal** finished in second place. The 7-8 girls again took everything with **Chloe Siebach**

grabbing first place (32.84), **Meagan McRoberts**, second, **Allie Delgado**, third, **Keelyn McLaughlin** (Oh, Lucy you're so fine...), fourth, **Natalie Anderson**, fifth, and **Katie Fosse**, sixth.

It was a near sweep in both the 9-10 boys' and girls' events as **Dan Traxler** claimed first place (57.52), **Patrick Cary** took second, **Harper McGrath**, third, **Chris Fertal**, fourth and **Josh Christenson**, fifth. **Margaret Murphy** raced in for first place (56.77), followed by **Allison Brouckman** in third, **Catherine Muncy** in fourth, **Madison Fosse** in fifth and **Mary Stony** in sixth place.

Jack Brennan stroked in to a first place finish in 11-12 boys with a time of 51.08.
