Fox Mill Woods Fintastics vs. Walden Glen Wahoos – June 30, 2001

After a tough opening week meet in nasty weather, the Fox Mill Wood Fintastics were looking for a strong and sunny performance against the visiting Walden Glen Wahoos. While the Wahoos sported great-looking orange and blue swim suits, would their swimmers be equally cool in the water?

As it turned out, the meet was marked by a dominating performance by the Fintastics' **Scott Hubal**, in two different categories, including one new NVSL record.

The freestyle events proved to be balanced, with the Fintastics breaking out to a narrow 48-42 lead. First place finishers included **Kristen Callahan, William Byrne, Sascha Reed, Lindsay Ward** and **Tommy Huycke**. Second place honors went to **Andrew Gyenis** (of Paris, France), **Edward Reed, Matthew Montgomery, Katie Callahan** and **Jennifer**

Dolson. Third placers included **Leanne Hyer**, **Jack Brennan**, **Melissa Jarmas**, **Amanda Hubal** and **Sarah Wallace**.

Prospects for a winning event got brighter in the back event, with the Fintastics pulling out to a 97-83 margin. But the true fireworks – delivered several days before Independence Day - were delivered by Scott Hubal, aging up in the 13-14 event. Scott, suffering from a heavy cold, turned in a 31.35, smashing the 11-12 team record by more than two seconds, and establishing in the process a new NVSL record. Way to go, Scott! Other first place finishers included Leanne Hyer, Michael Hallock, Erica Demson and Hannah Cohen. Gathering second place points were Allison Pinegar, Christopher Kearns, Suzanne Huycke, Kelly Sherman, Austin Hyland and Allison Kendrick. Third placers included Andrew Gyenis, Stephanie Hallock, Kevin Pujanauski, Ana Demson, Brian Pujanauski and Sarah Wallace.

As often happens with Fox Mill Woods is on a roll, the Fintastics essentially put the meet away First place honors went to by breastroke. Second place finishers included Jack Brennan, Katie Callahan, Suzanne Huycke, Annie Brennan (of San Jose, Costa Rica), Patrick Hines and Jennifer Callahan, Matthew Montgomery and Jennifer Dolson. Third place points were gathering up by Dan Traxler, Caroline Beury, Melissa Jarmas, Christopher Kearns and Brendan Lins. In our first sweep of the season, the trio of Pujanauski, Hines and Lins took the 15-18 boys event and sealed the Wahoos' fate. Can you say, Fintastics, 158, Wahoos, 112?

what becoming dominating In was а performance by the team, the Fintastics widened the lead during the fly event. Okay, okay, Scottie set another team record with a Hubalicious 31.15 as he aged up in the 13-14 event. Other first place finishers included Edward Reed, Sascha Reed, Amanda Hubal (who wowed the audience earlier with a stirringsung National Anthem, Coach Tommy Huycke and Allison Kendrick. Finishing second were Erica Demson, William Byrne and Austin Hyland. Third-place points were added by Coach Brigid Howland, Ana Demson and Zachary Kearns.

Going into the relays, Fox Mill Woods ruled, 200-142.

In the 8 and under 100 meter free relay, the girls team of **Leanne Hyer**, **Stephanie Hallock**, **Alison Jarmas** and **Kristen Callahan** easily won with a time of 1:33.66. After dropping the next three events, the Fintastics ripped off three straight winning heats.

The 11-12 girls medley relay team of **Kirsten Siebach, Ana Demson, Suzanne Huycke** and **h** edged out the Wahoos with a time of 1:12.26. The 13-14 boys medley relay team of **Matthew Montgomery, Zachary Kearns, Ben Coffinberger** and **Scott Hubal** also powered to victory with a time of 1:13.03. On the girls side, the team of **Hannah Cohen, Amanda Hubal, Lindsay Ward** and **Kelly Sherman** easily bested the Wahoos with a 1:08.92.

The Fintastics continued an excellent performance by winning eight of 12 relay events. Winning 8-and-under girls freestyle were **Leanne Hyer, Allison Brouckman, Alison Jarmas** and **Kristen Callahan** with a 1:39:31. Winning the 9-10 medley were **Edward Reed, Liam McLaughlin, Michael Hallock** and **Jack Brennan**, with a 1:25.84.

The boys and girls both won the 11-12 medley. Christopher Kearns, William Byrne, Thomas Burton and Scott Hubal turned in a 1:15.78 while Kirsten Siebach, Suzanne Huycke, Ana Demson and Sascha Reed turned in a 1:11.87.

Our 13-14 girls, **Hannah Cohen**, **Amanda Hubal**, **Lindsay Ward** and **Kelly Sherman**, took the medley with a time of 1:07.96.

Moving up to 15-18, 200 meters, both our boys and girls took the medley events. The boys, **Austin Hyland, Michael Leeds, Brian Pujanauski** and **Tommy Huycke**, turned in a 2:20.93 and coasted to victory. The girls, **Jennifer Dolson, Jennifer Callahan, Brigid Howland** and **Allison Kendrick**, took a nail biter with a 2:25.06.

The Fintastics also won the boys mixed 200 meter freestyle relay. Scott Hubal, Michael Hallock, Matthew Montgomery and Tommy Huycke swam a 2:04.62 and easily won.

Final score, Fox Mill Woods 240, Walden Glen 162.

Coach Shelley said, "We had a fantastic win after a hard week of practice and I especially liked how our swimmers fought hard even though some were suffering from colds and injuries. **Scott Hubal's** records were awesome and he should be very proud. Our young team is making great progress. Let's go out and win again on Saturday."

Notable improvements this week: Laura Duggan, a 20 percent improvement in her backstroke time; Caroline Beury, a 14 percent improvement in her breastroke; Allison Pinegar, a 12 percent improvement in fly; Thomas Burton and Kimberly Blauer, a 10 percent improvement in fly; and Jack Brennan, a 10 percent improvement in breastroke. Congratulations to many others who significantly improved their times this week!

<u>The Monday Night Action: Fox Mill Woods</u> <u>vs. Hiddenbrook</u>

Were those blue lips from the cool weather or the ring pops? There were brisk sales at the concessions as well as some brisk swimming in the pool on Monday night against Hiddenbrook. Our swimmers set 49 new personal best records, and our team collected first place ribbons in 28 events. Way to go FMW swimmers! Specific results are as follows:

Freestyle

In the boys 6 & under events, **J.T. Byrne** took 4th place for the Fintastics. FMW had a strong showing in the Girls 6 & under, led by **Stephanie Hallock** in first place, **Chloe Siebach** in third and **Meagan McRoberts** in fourth.

Not to be outdone, the 7 and 8 year boys grabbed first place (Andy Putch), third (Steven Robbins) and sixth (Jimmy O'Connor). FMW swept the first four places in the Girls' 7 and 8 event. Alison Jarmas powered to first, Allison Brouckman, second, Katie Roberts, third, and Caroline Beury, fourth.

The FMW 9 year old boys gave a strong performance, with **Bobby Demson** finishing first and **David Rawlins** in fifth. Likewise, the 9 year old girls took four of the top five places, with **Allison Pinegar** in second, **Lauren Angel** in third, **Katherine Leeds** in fourth and **Kimberly Blauer** in fifth.

"Dominant" was the word to describe the FMW Boys 10 year olds in the freestyle events. First place went to Liam McLaughlin, second to John Suyama, third to William Happ. Catherine Murphy ably represented the 10 year old girls with a second place freestyle finish.

How about those 11-12 boys? Chris Kearns took first, Dylan McLaughlin, second, Thomas Burton, third, and Jason Horneck, sixth in the freestyle.

And what about the 11-12 girls? **Ana Demson** stroked to second place, **Suzanne** Huycke took fourth, **Rosie Montgomery** and **Abby Clement**, brought home fifth and sixth, respectively.

In the boys 13-14 event, second place went to Steven Matthews-Rurak followed by Zach Kearns in third. Five out of the top six places in the Girls' 13-14 freestyle went to the swift swimmers of FMW. The results: Kayley Byrne, second, Lizzie Hines, third, Bridget Lins, fourth, Anna Clement, fifth, and Annie Brennan, sixth.

The top two places in the Boys 15-18 event went to **Rob Burton** and **Mike Leeds**, respectively. The girls' 15-18 events were strong for FMW, with **Brigid Howland** in second place and **Jen Leeds** in fourth.

Backstroke

Surpassing even his own performance in the freestyle, **J.T. Byrnes** took third in the Boys 6 & under backstroke. FMW was successful in the Girls 6 & under, bringing home first place (Emily Wade), second (**Chloe Siebach**), fourth, (**Laura Brouckman**) and sixth (**Christina Gill**).

Determined stroking led to a first place finish for Andy Putch in the Boys 7-8 backstroke. Steven Robbins took second in this event, followed by Jimmy O'Connor with a fifth place finish.

The girls swept the 7-8 event, winning first, second, third and fourth places! **Caroline Beury** powered to a first place finish, **Katie Roberts** took home second place honors, **Sarah Wall** added points with a third place finish and **Alina Suyama** contributed a fourth place for FMW.

A solid effort in the Boys 9-10 resulted in a first place finish for **Jack Brennan** and a second for **Liam McLaughlin**. **Melissa Jarmas** secured second place in the Girls 9-10 backstroke.

Thomas Burton took second place in the Boys 11-12 heats.

Breaststroke

The Girls 7-8 heats were dominated by FMW as **Leanne Hyer** touched in first and **Abby Reed**, second.

The Fintastics grabbed most of the glory in the Girls 9-10, with **Sally Wade** finishing first, Katherine Leeds, fourth, **Allison Pinegar**, fifth and **Catherine Murphy**, sixth.

The Boys 11-12 event saw **Dylan McLaughlin** finish 3rd and **Jason Horneck**, fourth. The girls in this age group turned in good performances; **Melissa Duvall** finished first, **Abby Clement**, third, and **Ana Demson**, fourth.

Second place in the Boys 13-14 backstroke went to **Zach Kearns** while four of the top six finishes in the Girls 13-14 went to FMW. Here, **Kayley Byrne** secured third, **Anna Clement**, fourth, **Lizzie Hines**, fifth, and **Bridget Lins**, sixth.

Our biggest swimmers were also the best in their age group! **Rob Burton** brought home first and **Mike Leeds**, second, in the Boys 15-18. Outpacing the field for the Girls 15-18 event was **Jen Leeds**.

Butterfly

The Fintastics flew through the water to claim first and second in the Girls 8 & under 'fly. **Leanne Hyer** got to the wall first and **Alison Jarmas**, second.

Likewise, Bob Demson took first and William Happ, second, in the Boys 9-10 event. Melissa Jarmas defended the honor of FMW in the Girls 9-10 butterfly, securing a third place finish. Chris Kearns and Melissa Duvall contributed points for the Fintastics by bringing home first place finishes in the Boys and Girls 11-12 heats.

Individual Medley

Super results were posted by the Boys 9 & under Fintastics in the IM. Michael Hallock took first and Bobby Demson, second.

The 10 year olds took top honors, with **Edward Reed** and **Erica Demson** both bringing home first place ribbons. **Melissa Jarmas** contributed a fourth place finish in this event.

The 11-12 Boys swept the top three spots; Scott Hubal finished first, Will Byrne, second and Chris Kearns, third.

Equally awesome were the 11-12 Girls, led by first place finisher, **Kirsten Siebach**. **Sascha Reed** grabbed second place, **Suzanne Huycke**, fourth, and **Ana Demson**, sixth. In the Boys 13-14, **Matt Montgomery** took top honors.

The FMW Girls 13-14 IM team had a good showing. Stroking to second place was **Hannah Cohen**, followed by **Amanda Hubal** in third, **Kelly Sherman** in fourth and **Lindsay Ward** in fifth.

The top three finishers in the Boys 15-18 IM were all from FMW. First place went to **Tommy Huycke**, second to **Rob Burton** and third to **Joey Coffinberger**.

Walking away with the top four places in the Girls 15-18 were the Fintastics. First went to **Allison Kendrick**, second to **Jennifer Dolson**, third to **Sarah Wallace** and fourth to **Brigid Howland**.

Some "double digit" time improvements came to Caroline Beury with a 15% improvement in backstroke, Jack Brennan 16% improvement in backstroke, Christina Gill 15% improvement in freestyle, Leanne Hyer 13% improvement in breaststroke, Meagan McRoberts 11% improvement in freestyle, Liam McLaughlin 19% improvement in backstroke, Jimmy O'Connor 10% improvement in freestyle, Steven Robbins 19% improvement in freestyle and 12% in backstroke. Keep up the great work!

Congratulations to **Scott Hubal** for breaking the club record in 11-12 IM with a time of 1:13.86, beating the old record by more than a second. Scott is breaking the record for breaking records!
