<u>Fox Mill Woods Fintastics vs. – the Arlington</u> Forest Tigers -July 7, 2001

The scrappy Fox Mill Wood Fintastics went into Week Three of the summer swim season looking for back-to-back wins and a chance to up their record to 2-1. The opponents were the visiting Tigers of Arlington Forest, a dangerous, well-balanced competitor.

Like well-trained racing fish, the Fintastics jumped to an early lead in freestyle. First place finishers included Andrew Gyenis, Leanne Hyer, Michael Hallock, Sascha Reed, Scott Hubal, Lindsay Ward and Tommy Huycke. Piling on second place points were Katie Callahan, William Byrne, Kirsten Siebach, Steven Matthews-Rurak, Amanda Hubal and Jennifer Dolson. Third placers included Jack Brennan, Melissa Jarmas, Dylan McLaughlin, Rob Burton and Sarah Wallace. It was all Fox Mills Woods, 58-32.

In the back event, the Tigers clawed back with seven first place finishes, but the Fintastics swarmed the opposition with lots of second and third place points. Our first placers included Edward Reed, Erica Demson and Hannah Cohen. Gathering second place points were Leanne Hyer, Bobby Demson, Christopher Matthew Suzanne Huycke, Kearns, Montgomery, Kelly Sherman, Rob Burton and Allison Kendrick. Third placers included Andrew Gyenis, Alison Jarmas, Suyama, Allison Pinegar, Kevin Pujanauski, Ana Demson, Zachary Kearns, Sherman and (whew!) Austin Hyland. That's right, nine out of 10 possible third place finishes! That's why finishing hard is so important. By gathering up so many second and third place points, the Fintastics actually widened the lead to 105-75.

Coach Shelley had her fishies darting from one end of the pool to the other. A strong breastroke event would put the Tigers back in their cages. And that is just what happened! First place honors went to Michael Hallock, Katie Callahan, Kirsten Siebach, Hannah Cohen and Jennifer Dolson. Second place finishers included Dan Traxler, Melissa Jarmas, Suzanne Huycke, Kevin Pujanauski, Brian Pujanauski and Jennifer Callahan. Third place points were gathering up by Caroline Beury, Liam McLaughlin and Dylan McLaughlin (tie), and Patrick Hines. The Fintastics had pulled away to a very commanding 152-116 lead.

Next, our strong butterfliers took wing, leaving Tigers in our wake. In first place were **Edward Reed, Kristen Callahan** (first butterfly as a newly-minted nine year old), **Sascha Reed, Matthew Montgomery** and **Amanda Hubal**. Finishing second were **Bobby Demson, Scott Hubal**, **Melissa Duvall**, **Zachary Kearns, Coach Tommy Huvcke** and **Allison Kendrick**.

Third-place points were added by Coach Brigid Howland, Austin Hyland and Kelly Sherman.

Going into the relays, Fox Mill Woods ruled, 198-141.

In the 8 and under 100 meter free relay, the boys team of **Andy Putch**, **Patrick Cary**, **Dan Traxler** and **Andrew Gyenis** won with a time of 1:39.72.

Beginning with the 9-10 medley relay, the Fintastics powered to seven straight winning relay events.

In 9-10 boys, the team of Jack Brennan, Edward Reed, Liam McLaughlin and Michael Hallock won with a time of 1:27.43. The girls, Katie Callahan, Kristen Callahan, Melissa Jarmas and Erica Demson, won with a 1:25.66

The 11-12 boys, the team of Christopher Kearns, William Byrne, Dylan McLaughlin and Scott Hubal won with a 1:14.53. The girls, Suzanne Huycke, Kirsten Siebach, Ana Demson and Sascha Reed won with a time of 1:14.50.

The 13-14 boys medley relay team of **Jason Horneck, Matthew Montgomery, Zachary Kearns and Steven Matthews-Rurak** won with a time of 1:20.03. On the girls' side, the team of **Kelly Sherman, Amanda Hubal, Lindsay Ward** and **Hannah Cohen** beat the Tigers with a 1:08.37.

The 15-18 boys, 200 meter medley, **Brian Pujanauski, Tommy Huycke, Austin Hyland** and **Rob Burton**, won with a time of 2:11.96. In the mixed 200 meter free relay, the boys team of **Scott Hubal, Michael Hallock, Matthew Montgomery** and **Tommy Huycke** easily won with a time of 2:05.87.

Final score, Fox Mill Woods 243, Arlington Forest 156. The Fintastics are now 2-1 for the season.

Coach Shelley said, "We had a great effort and I especially liked all of those strong second and third place finishes. Those points really added up. Our team continues to make great progress. Let's have a good week of practice and try for our third win of the summer."

Notable improvements this week: John Suyama, a 17 percent improvement in backstroke; Kristen Callahan, a 13 percent improvement in fly; Dan Traxler, a nine percent improvement in back; Lauren Angel, a seven percent improvement in fly and Steven Matthews-Rurak, a seven percent improvement in back. Congratulations to many others who significantly improved their times this week!

Congratulations to our swimmers and their strong efforts against a tough Oakton team. Keep up this great work. Results of the meet:

Freestyle

J.T. Byrne started us off with a fifth place finish in the boys 6 & under (over a 6% improvement in his time!) Once again our 6 & under girls came in strong with a first place to Stephanie Hallock, second place to Chloe Siebach and fifth place to Laura Brouckman (over 6% time improvement).

Backstroke

Our 7 & 8 year old boys had great finishes with first place going to **Dan Traxler** (nearly 10%

improvement!), third to Jimmy O'Connor and 6th to Steven Robbins. Alison Jarmas took fifth place in the girls 7 & 8 year olds.

Bobby Demson swam a powerful freestyle in the 9 year old boys, taking first place and improving his time by 11%! The 9 year old girls did very well, with second place going to Allison Pinegar, third to lauren Angel and fourth to Katherine Leeds.

Our 10 year old boys were working hard with Liam McLaughlin capturing first place, Evan Hyer taking third, John Suyama grabbing fourth and Will Happ placing fifth.

In the 11-12 boys, Chris Kearns took third place, and Jason Horneck placed fifth, both with new personal bests! Not to be outdone, our 11-12 girls Ana Demson (third place) and Laura Duggan (fifth place) also turned in new personal best times!

In the 13-14 boys event fourth place went to Zach Kearns and fifth to Ben Coffinberger. Our 13-14 girls were looking fantastic with Kayley Byrne powering to first place (nearly 5% improvement in her time!), Lizzie Hines grabbing third place, and Bridget Lins and Anna Clement taking fifth and sixth respectively.

The 15-18 boys were looking good with second place going to Brendan Lins, fifth place to Mike Leeds, and 6th place to Patrick Hines (over 4% improvement in time). Our Julia Richmond represented the 15-18 girls well with a third place finish.

Backstroke

J.T. Byrne again improved his time and took a fourth place in the boys 6 & under backstroke. Our 6 & under girls swept their event with first place going to Chloe Siebach, second place to Laura Brouckman and third place to Keelyn McLaughlin.

The 7 & 8 year old boys did well with Dan Traxler powering to a first place and Steven Robbins taking fourth place. Katie Roberts matched his fourth place in the 7-8 year old girls. She improved her time 11%!!

The 9-10 boys looked solid with Jack Brennan taking second place and Liam McLaughlin with fifth place. Our 9-10 girls also looked solid with Melissa Jarmas claiming second place, Emily Chamberlin finishing in fifth place (over 5% improvement) and Katherine Lucas finishing in sixth place.

In the 11-12 boys Thomas Burton had a strong second place finish. Abby Clement and Laura Duggan secured second and third places respectively in the 11-12 girls.

Julia Richmond had a powerful second place finish in the 15-18 backstroke.

Breaststroke

In the 7-8 year old girls Leanne Hyer claimed second place and Allison Brouckman fourth place.

Katherine Leeds swam a solid effort and took third place in breastroke, followed by Allison Pinegar who improved her time and took fifth place.

Steven Sharer improved his time nearly 15% in breaststroke and took fourth place in the 11-12 boys. Our 11-12 girls swam hard to a third place finish

for Melissa Duvall and 6th place for Rosie Montgomery.

Our 13-14 girls were again strong, with Anna Clement taking first place and Kayley Byrne finishing third.

Mike Leeds represented us well with a new personal best in the 15-18 boys and third place. Eliza Brennan powered in to a first place finish in the 15-18 girls.

Butterfly

Fine performances were recorded by Alison Jarmas and Leanne Hyer, finishing second and third respectively in the 8 & under girls.

The 9-10 boys butterfly resulted in Will Happ grabbing third place. Our Lauren Angel grabbed fifth place in the 9-10 girls event.

A very strong showing was turned in by our 11-12 boys as **Jason Horneck** took first place, **Thomas Burton**, second, and **Dylan McLaughlin**, fourth. **Suzanne Huycke** represented our girls with a fourth place finish in butterfly.

Good swims were turned in by **Bridget Lins** with fourth place and **Lizzie Hines** with fifth in the 13-14 girls event.

Brendan Lins looked super with his big first place finish in the 15-18 race.

Individual Medley

In the 9 & under boys **Bobby Demson** took a dominant first place finish, as did **Kristen Callahan** in the 9 & under girls.

Erica Demson and **Melissa Jarmas** looked terrific in their first and second place finishes in the 10 year old girls event.

Willy Byrne grabbed second place and Chris Kearns fourth in the 11-12 boys. In the 11-12 girls Kirsten Siebach continued her strong IM performances with a first place finish and Suzanne Huycke dropped her time more than four seconds with her fourth place finish.

In the 13-14 boys Matt Montgomery and Zach Kearns took fourth and 6th places. Hannah Cohen and Lindsay Ward both had personal bests in their respective first and second place finishes.

In the 15-18 boys **Tommy Huycke** swam tough competition, but rose to the occasion and grabbed a personal best and third place.

The 15-18 girls resulted in **Jen Dolson** in second place and **Jen Callahan** in fourth. **Amanda Hubal**, aging up, took 6th place and dropped her time nearly 4%.

Lollipop Meet

The Lollipop Meet for our youngest Fintastics will be held at 6 p.m. on Thursday, July 19 at Oakton pool. FMW warm-ups will be at 5:00.

Here are the guidelines we will follow for this meet:

The meet is open to all swimmers aged 8 and under. Each swimmer can choose two events plus a modified Individual Medley (no butterfly). A swimmer may NOT choose a stroke he regularly swims in A meets, even if he has not placed. Events will be broken down into age groups (5, 6, 7, 8). Heat winner ribbons will be awarded for every heat and lollipops distributed to each swimmer. There will be no stroke and turn judges, so no DQ's! Times from the Lollipop Meet will not be used to determine eligibility for A meets.

Every team has been asked to provide three timers and a clerk of course. Teenagers are welcome to time. We'd like to have extra volunteers, so people can trade off during the meet.

There will be a sign-up sheet at the lifeguard desk area soon for swimmers as well as volunteers.
