Fox Mill Woods Fintastics vs. Riverside Gardens Tsunamis -July 21, 2001

Entering into the final week of the regular swim season, Fox Mill Woods took a three-meet winning streak into Division Six Riverside Gardens. The home-pool Tsunami presented a balanced opponent, with significant strength in breast and butterfly and a strong relay team. If the Fintastics were going to prevail against this upper division foe, we were going to have to keep it close through each event.

In freestyle, the Fintastics were up to the task. In 8-and-under, both **Andrew Gyenis and Leanne Hyer** pulled off second place finishes. In 9-10 boys, **Patrick Sullivan** also pulled in second. Then, in five of the next seven events, the

Fintastics finished first. Heat winners included Katie Callahan, Scott Hubal, Ana Demson, Matthew Montgomery and Tommy Huycke. Additional second place points were added by Sascha Reed and Jennifer Dolson. William Byrne, Lindsay Ward and Austin Hyland added valuable third place points. Scott Hubal's effort secured him yet another 11-12 boys freestyle record, with a 28.44. By the end of freestyle, the Tsumani held a slim 47-43 lead.

In backstroke Riverside Gardens dominated the first place ribbons, but Fox Mill Woods kept the meet extremely close with strong second and third place efforts. First place finishers included Erica Demson, Matthew Montgomery and Kelly Sherman. Second place points were added by Andrew Gyenis, Edward Reed, Allison Pinegar, Suzanne Huycke, Hannah Cohen, Rob Burton and Sarah Wallace. Third place finishers included Dan Traxler, Leanne Hyer, Christopher Kearns, Abby Clement, Zachary Kearns, Lindsay Ward, Brian Pujanauski and Julia Richmond. The Tsunami kept a slim 93-87 lead.

While the Fintastics usually pile on the points in breaststroke, the Tsunami proved worthy competitors in this event. Fox Mill Woods first place honors went to **Katie Callahan**, **Hannah Cohen** and **Jennifer Dolson**. Second place finishers included **Michael Hallock**, **Melissa Jarmas**, **Suzanne Huycke**, **Annie Brennan**, **Brian Pujanauski** and **Jennifer Callahan**. Third place points were gathering up by **Dan Traxler**, **Ben Coffinberger**, **Patrick Hines** and **Eliza Brennan**. Riverside Gardens build a wider lead, 146-124.

In fly, **Scott Hubal** set another team record, with a first place finishing time of 30.76. Sister

Amanda Hubal also scored a thrilling first place finish with a touch time of 34.13, beating the second place 34.34. Michael Hallock also took first place honors. Second place finishes were made by Kristen Callahan, Ana Demson, Coach Tommy Huycke and Coach Brigid Howland. Third place points were added by Sascha Reed and Jennifer Callahan.

In relays, the 9-10 girls, **Katie Callahan**, **Kristen Callahan**, **Melissa Jarmas and Erica Demson**, won with a time of 1:22.68. The 13-14 girls also won, with **Hannah Cohen**, **Amanda Hubal**, **Kelly Sherman** and **Sascha Reed** turning in a time of 1:07.69.

Including the 13-14 girls, the Fintastics won the final five events, finishing strongly.

The 15-18 boys, 200 meter medley, **Brian Pujanauski, Tommy Huycke, Austin Hyland** and **Rob Burton**, won with a time of 2:09.73. The girls, **Jennifer Callahan, Brigid Howland, Sarah Wallace** and **Jennifer Dolson**, also prevailed with a time of 2:24.41

In the mixed 200 meter free relay, the boys team of **Scott Hubal, Michael Hallock, Matthew Montgomery** and **Tommy Huycke** easily won with a time of 2:03.86. As did the girls, **Ana Demson, Katie Callahan, Sascha Reed** and **Jennifer Dolson**, with a time of 2:18.33.

Final score, Tsunami 214, Fintastics 188. The Fintastics finished 3-2 for the season and 3-1 in the division. The record was good for second place in the division.

Coach Shelley said, "We had a great effort at Riverside Gardens and we finished strongly, especially considering we were missing some strong swimmers at this event. This was one of our best seasons, with good practices, great meets and lots of team spirit. I will remember these kids and their dedication to the sport." Notable improvements this week: **Joey Coffinberger**, a 12 percent improvement in fly; **Abby Clement**, a 9 percent improvement in breast and **Dan Traxler**, an 8 percent improvement in breast. Congratulations to many others who significantly improved their times this week!

Freestyle

The 7 and 8 year old girls were getting it done with **Alison Jarmas** taking first place, **Allison Brouckman**, second place, **Abby Reed**, third place and **Sarah Wall**, sixth place.

In the 9 year old boys, **Bobby Demson** swam to a first place finish, with **David Rawlins** taking third place and **Eric Sharer** grabbing fourth. The 9 year old girls competed hard and it paid off; **Allison Pinegar** got second place, **Katherine Leeds**, third, and **Lauren Angel**, fourth.

Evan Hyer never looked back as he posted a solid first place finish in the 10 year old boys heats, followed by **John Suyama** in third place and **Will Happ** in fourth place. **Kim Blauer** grabbed third place in the 10 year old girls event, followed by **Emily Chamberlin** in fourth place.

In the 11-12 boys heats, **Tom Burton** zipped in for a first place finish immediately followed by **Chris Kearns** in second and **Steven Sharer** in fourth. **Suzanne Huycke** powered in for a first place finish in the girls 11-12 with **Abby Clement** right behind in second. **Laura Duggan** touched in for third and **Rosie Montgomery**, for fifth.

Zach Kearns grabbed a second place finish in the 13-14 boys freestyle. The 13-14 girls grabbed the two top spots: **Kayley Byrne** had a great first place finish followed by **Annie Brennan** in second place.

Backstroke

The 7 and 8 year old boys event saw Fintastics **Steven Robbins** and **Thomas Maw** finish first and third respectively. In the 7 and 8 year old girls competition, **Sarah Wall** claimed first place, **Margaret Murphy**, third place, and **Elizabeth Osborn**, fifth place.

It was a good race in the 9-10 boys backstroke where **Evan Hyer** took first place and **Liam McLaughlin**, second place. This was followed by a great showing of our 9-10 girls where **Katherine Leeds** came in second, **Sally Wade** third, **Kimberly Blauer** fourth, **Katherine Lucas**, fifth and **Lauren Groskaufmanis** sixth.

Breaststroke

The 7-8 year old boys event saw **Andy Putch** capture first place and **Jimmy O'Connor**, second. **Leanne Hyer** had a strong first place finish followed by **Allison Brouckman** in second place.

Bobby Demson was the first place finisher in 9-10 boys, and our strong 9-10 girls took home four of the top six spots: **Sally Wade**, first, **Allison Pinegar**, second, **Emily Chamberlin**, fifth, **Kim Blauer**, sixth.

In 11-12 boys event, **Jason Horneck** brought home second place. Another strong showing by the girls saw **Abby Clement** in first place, **Melissa Duvall** in second, **Ana Demson** in third and **Jennifer Tummarello** in fifth.

The 15-18 boys brought home the glory for Fox Mill Woods, taking the top four spots. The fastest finisher was **Tommy Huycke**, followed by **Brendan Lins** in second, **Mike Leeds** in third and **Pat Hines** in fourth. To cap off the evening, the 15-18 girls dominated their IM event. **Jennifer Dolson** carried away the top honors, with **Sarah Wallace** in second, **Brigid Howland** in third and **Monica Lins** in fourth.
